

TTiS Privacy Policy

In line with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) act, 25 May 2018, we are required to re-state the purposes for which we hold your personal information, and to obtain your explicit permission to do so.

The information we hold is as requested on the current membership application form, namely: first name, surname, email address, contact telephone number, core profession, professional experience, professional interests.

In the first instance, this information is requested in order to assess eligibility for membership (ie therapists working in Scotland with clients/patients who have experienced trauma).

Following approval as a member, the information held is used to communicate with members on a range of issues, including the following:

- TTiS training opportunities
- Further information about courses and workshops to those registered for events
- Fundraising initiatives carried out by members for TTiS or related causes (approved by the Committee)
- Publicity for events held by associated organisations (approved by the Committee)

In addition, the booking form for events captures information on any special requirements (dietary, access, etc) that would be needed to ensure that suitable conditions are provided for all participants.

Communication with the membership by default is by email, and members are asked to update us of any changes to their email address. Where this is not done, and/or there are repeated address failures, members may be removed from the membership list.

Normally, members and participants are emailed individually or in blind copy, so that addresses are not made public (even to other members and participants), and not passed on to third parties without the member's consent. An exception to this might be made where it has been agreed by all participants at a course or event to share personal details.
